ADVERBS OF MANNER

• Adverbs of manner tell us <u>how</u> something happens. They are usually placed after the main verb or after the object.

E.g. She drinks **quickly**. He plays the piano **softly**.

• Adverbs of manner are formed, by adding -ly to an adjective:

E.g. silent – silently safe – safely

calm - calmly loud - loudly

• For adjectives ending in -y, we change -y to -i and then add -ly:

E.g. hungry – hungrily angry – angrily

• For adjectives ending in **-le**, we drop the **-e** and then add **-y**:

E.g. terrible – terribly horrible – horribly

A few adverbs of manner have the <u>same</u> form as the adjective.
We do not add -ly:

E.g. straight—straight fast—fast late—late
