## **ADVERBS OF MANNER**

Adverbs of manner tell us how something happens. They are usually placed after the main verb or after the object.

E.g. She drinks **quickly**. He plays the piano **softly**.

• Adverbs of manner are formed, by adding -ly to an adjective:

E.g. silent – silently	safe – safely
calm – calmly	loud – loudly

• For adjectives ending in -y, we change -y to -i and then add -ly:

E.g. hungry – hungrily angry – angrily

For adjectives ending in **-le**, we drop the **-e** and then add **-y**:

E.g. terrible – terribly horrible – horribly

- A few adverbs of manner have the same form as the adjective. We do not add -ly:
  - E.g. straight-straight fast fast late – late
