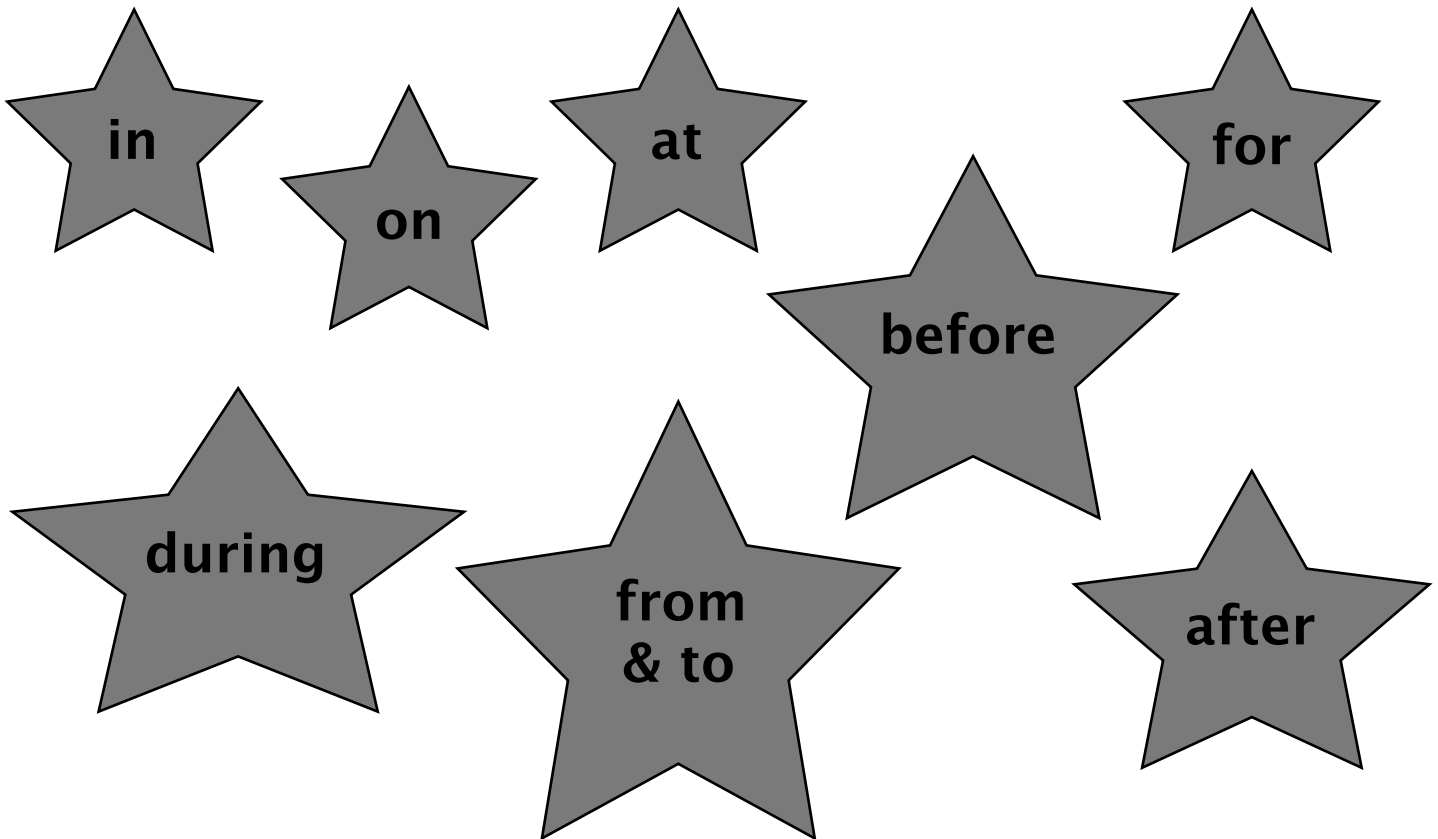

Prepositions of Time







Prepositions of time help to describe **when** something happens. Here are some common prepositions of time:
