



TEACHING AND LEARNING

ENGLISH

Throughout the past academic year, the English Department has been diligently working to bridge the educational gaps brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. Our primary focus has been on addressing deficiencies faced by our students in writing, speaking, and collaboration skills. By implementing targeted strategies and offering additional support, we have been aiming to help students overcome these obstacles.

To enrich the comprehensive learning experience of our students, we introduced new grammar textbooks across all six grades. These resources were designed to cater to the evolving needs of our students. By providing more advanced content, we strive to cultivate a deeper comprehension and mastery of grammar concepts by our students.

In an effort to enhance students' reading proficiency and expose them to diverse literary genres, we introduced reading anthologies to Grades 1 to 4. These anthologies offer a variety of texts, nurturing students' reading abilities and broadening their literary horizons. Moreover, collaborative activities were implemented to augment comprehension and engagement. In addition to the reading buddy system between Grade 1 and 6 students, where older students mentored their younger counterparts to enhance reading fluency, interactive reading sessions were organised across various grades.

To further enhance students' writing skills and give them opportunities to write beyond summative assessments, a comprehensive array of activities was integrated into the curriculum. In Grades 1 to 6, various writing tasks were introduced to foster creativity and proficiency in language expression. Grade 1 and 3 delved into experiential writing, cultivating narratives rooted in personal experiences. Grade 2 embarked on open-

topic writing, encouraging imaginative and unrestricted exploration of ideas. Grade 3 engaged in cultural exchange through pen pal correspondences with students in Canada, broadening their global perspectives. Grade 4 undertook descriptive writing, depicting vivid accounts of their visit to a World War II cemetery. Grade 5 experimented with different topics ranging from letter writing, journaling and writing opinion pieces. Grade 6 honed their concise storytelling abilities by crafting compelling 100-word stories. Additionally, they undertook diverse projects, such as designing brochures spotlighting their favourite city in China, and delving into argumentative writing honing their research, writing and presentation skills.

To foster student engagement and interest, we actively promoted language-based competitions tailored to their interests. Additionally, we introduced drama as an extracurricular activity to provide students with a platform to explore their theatrical talents.

Moreover, we launched a range of linguistic and literary extracurricular activities like Choral Speech, Battle of the Books, Debate Club and Reader's Theatre, offering students opportunities to enhance their language skills and literary appreciation. Character Day and Book Cover Design Competition were organised for students. Students also actively participated in competitions including the Hong Kong Young Writers Awards, Canadian English Writing Competition and Asian English Spelling. These activities encompass various areas such as creative writing, public speaking, and critical analysis.

The Choral Speaking Team secured third place in the prestigious Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival. Their exemplary effort and teamwork have brought them recognition. Students also took part in many other competitions. Information of the competition results can be found in the List of Selective Prize Winners.

Looking ahead, our commitment remains unwavering in providing a dynamic and immersive English language learning experience for our students. We will persist in adapting and innovating to ensure their continuous growth and success in the ever-evolving educational landscape.

CHINESE

The Chinese curriculum places a strong focus on integrating daily life experiences to facilitate active learning and practical application of knowledge. By drawing connections between classroom teachings and real-world scenarios, students develop a deeper understanding of Chinese language and culture. This approach encourages students to engage with the language authentically, fostering not just linguistic proficiency but also a holistic appreciation for the rich heritage and traditions embedded within the Chinese language.

Grade 1 students rode a ferris wheel and then wrote about their experience. They also worked on group writing exercises about daily life, allowing them to write compositions in groups based on pictures. Simultaneously, "scenario dialogues" were used to strengthen their oral communication skills.

In Grade 2, drama was incorporated in lessons to allow students to interpret texts. To reinforce students' understanding of complex sentences, a sentence practice booklet was introduced. Grade 2 students also learnt the skills of writing short passages through the One Person, One Flower planting activity.

By optimising the school-based reading and writing materials, Grade 3 students' reading and writing abilities and interests have enhanced, making reading and writing training more flexible. To complement the Social and Cultural Studies unit on Inclusivity of Persons with Disabilities, it was used as the theme for the IBL project, engaging students in group studies to foster investigative thinking.

To complement the travelogue unit, Grade 4 students participated in the Ocean Park Nature Experience Activity for on-site observations and hands-on experiences, followed by practical writing exercises. During this period, interdisciplinary collaboration was conducted by integrating computer classes into the travelogue unit instruction. Additionally, timed writing assessments were introduced to improve students' writing. The Grade 4 curriculum also introduced poetry to cultivate students' appreciation for literature.

In Grade 5 and 6, composition booklets were aligned enabling students to engage in writing exercises systematically. To complement it further, Grade 5 students visited the Dr Sun Yat-sen Museum. In line with the Grade 6's Social and Cultural Studies curriculum, students visited the Legislative Council Complex, explored the facilities within the building, and engaged in discussions with legislators to enhance their understanding of the legislative process.

The Alternative Chinese Programme (翱翔課程), meticulously crafted for Grade 4 to 6 students with the International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme in mind, is designed to enhance students' analytical and critical thinking skills through a unique pedagogical approach. This initiative is a joint effort of the College and the Prep School. Students are encouraged to formulate their own research inquiries and immerse themselves in extensive reading of relevant books and articles. Over the years, the response from both parents and students has been overwhelmingly positive. As a result, the programme has expanded to two classes in Grade 4 to 6.

Activities and Competition

Engaging activities and challenges are pivotal in fostering a meaningful grasp of the language. Therefore, Chinese teachers arranged a diverse range of activities to add vibrancy to the learning process.

Grade 2 students attended a workshop and understood the characteristics of Chinese characters. They also participated in a Children's Poetry Creation Competition that unleashed their creativity. Additionally, a Calligraphy Competition was organised for them together with Grade 1 to cultivate their appreciation for the beauty of calligraphy. To stimulate students' interest in poetry and idioms, a Classical Poetry Competition and an Idiom Quiz Competition were organised for Grade 3 and 4, respectively.

Visits to the Hong Kong Palace Museum, the Hong Kong Museum of Coastal Defence, the Sam Tung Uk Museum, and the Police Museum were arranged for different grades to complement the Social and Cultural Studies curriculum. Special activities such as a Lantern Making Workshop, a Shadow Puppetry Workshop, and a visit to a Cha Chaan Teng were organised to help students gain a deeper understanding of Chinese and local culture.

This year, our students competed in different verse / prose categories for 228 places in the 75th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival and obtained remarkable results. The information can be found in the List of Selective Prize Winners.

MATHEMATICS

This academic year marked the return to whole-day lessons post-pandemic, enabling the complete implementation of the curriculum and teaching strategies. Encouraging examination results reflected student progress, with over 97% meeting or surpassing set academic goals. The resilience shown by both students and teachers post-pandemic was commendable.

In this academic year, significant progress was made in the enhancement of the mathematics curriculum across all grades. The implementation of the new Mathematics Education Key Learning Area Curriculum continued to show positive results, with a focus on adaptability to students' abilities and alignment with STEM and computer subjects. Teachers were able to fully apply the teaching plans of the new curriculum, leading to smooth and steady teaching and learning experiences.

To enhance student engagement and proficiency following school resumption, the school-based mathematics supplementary exercise books underwent revisions. These revisions were differentiated to align with students' abilities and interests, particularly focusing on Number Sense, Logic Training, and customised exercises to enhance calculation skills across Grades 1 to 6.

Activities and Competitions

The Mathematics Fun Day event was organised for Grades 3 to 6 in April, focusing on problem-solving skills and the application of mathematical knowledge through interactive games. Students collaborated in groups to tackle maths questions using iPads, fostering teamwork, analytical thinking, and enjoyment of mathematics.

Grade-specific competitions such as Times Table Speed Test, Smart Detective (logic), and Prime of the Prime were organised to enhance mathematical skills and logical reasoning among students. These competitions aimed to sharpen analytical abilities and reinforce fundamental mathematical concepts. Furthermore, the school's mathematics team excelled in various regional competitions, securing multiple gold medals at the Interschool Mathematical Olympiad. The dedication and hard work of team members were instrumental in achieving these outstanding results.

Cross-curricular activities involving collaboration between different subjects were implemented for Grades 1 to 5. These activities encouraged interdisciplinary learning and teamwork, fostering a holistic approach to education and allowing students to explore diverse areas of knowledge and skills.

The dedication of students and teachers in fostering mathematical proficiency and interdisciplinary learning has been instrumental in creating a dynamic and engaging academic environment.

SCIENCE AND HEALTH EDUCATION

The objective of the science and STEM programme is to cultivate practical application skills, critical thinking, and curiosity in students. We endeavour to foster a profound comprehension of scientific concepts, promote environmental sustainability, and foster digital well-being by means of interdisciplinary learning experiences, educational initiatives, and hands-on activities. Our Science and Health Education curriculum has been met with ardent student participation and engagement following the successful reintroduction of hands-on activities and group work.

Visit to Science Museum: To enhance science learning beyond the classroom, students visited the Science Museum. This experiential learning opportunity allowed them to explore scientific phenomena, engage with interactive exhibits, and deepen their understanding of various scientific principles. Additionally, cross-curricular activities were integrated to enrich science education, fostering connections between science and other subject areas for a more holistic learning experience.

The Green Hong Kong Initiative: It was implemented in Grade 3 and 6, aimed to promote eco-consciousness amongst students, encouraging sustainable practices and environmental awareness. Additionally, Grade 4 students built simple machines using recycled materials, fostering resourcefulness and environmental awareness.

Designing and Programming Video Games: Grade 5 students showcased their creativity and problem-solving skills by designing and programming their own video games.

Habitats: Grade 2 had the opportunity to construct habitats for various organisms.

Dome: The Dome activity offered an immersive exploration of the universe for Grade 1 to 6 students. Through interactive experiences, students delved into astronomical wonders, fostering curiosity and understanding of space.

Life Education Activity Programme (LEAP): Across all six grades, engaging lessons were organised by LEAP, a registered charity known for its health awareness and drug prevention programmes for primary and secondary students. These initiatives empower students to make informed choices about health and substance abuse for a healthier and safer future.

Good Touch Bad Touch: In alignment with our commitment to student safety and wellbeing, sessions on good touch and bad touch were conducted for students in Grades 1 and 2. These sessions aimed to educate students on personal boundaries, safe interactions, and strategies for seeking help in uncomfortable situations, reinforcing a culture of respect and empowerment.

Puberty Talk: The Puberty Talk initiative that was originally designed for Grade 5, was extended to Grade 6 following the COVID-19 pandemic. This session provided essential information and guidance on navigating the changes and challenges of adolescence.

Joyful Fruit Month: To promote physical wellbeing and healthy eating habits, the Joyful Fruit Month was celebrated in lower grades. By highlighting the importance of nutritious foods and fostering awareness of dietary habits, the aim is to instil lifelong practices that prioritise physical health and wellness.

Digital Quotient: Students' digital quotient was enhanced through various activities in all grades, sessions on digital wellbeing and cyberbullying awareness for Grade 3 to 6 underscore our commitment to promoting a safe and responsible digital environment for students.

As we move forward, we will continue to provide a comprehensive Science and Health Education curriculum that nurtures curiosity and critical thinking amongst our students.

MUSIC

The Music Department aims to cultivate a deep appreciation for music, nurturing creativity, self-expression, and collaboration amongst students. Through a diverse range

of musical experiences, including performance opportunities, music theory instruction, and exposure to various genres, the department seeks to develop well-rounded musicians who demonstrate proficiency, passion, and a lifelong love for music.

Instrument Programme

This academic year, 637 students were engaged in the School's music instrument classes. The information is presented below:

A set of Scales Syllabus was compiled and introduced to the instrument programme this academic year. Students were assessed with their own choice piece of music, together with the set scales in the instrument performance exam twice a year. Meanwhile, an Instrument Performance Examination Rubric was implemented to help students review their performances with clear feedback.

Activities and Master Classes

We strive to foster a deep appreciation for music across all levels by offering a diverse array of musical experiences, including participation in the Junior Choir, Intermediate Choir, Senior Choir, as well as instrumental groups such as the Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Junior Band, Elementary String Ensemble, and Junior String Ensemble. Additionally, Saxophone Ensembles were newly formed in this academic year.

Notably, our students benefited from exclusive Master Classes conducted by Prof. Tong Shiu Wai, a globally renowned conductor, and Ms Elise Bradley, a distinguished choral conductor from New Zealand. These enriching experiences not only honed their musical skills but also provided valuable insights and inspiration.

Competitions and Performances

Our choirs and instrumental groups performed on many occasions which included but was not limited to the Open Day and the Speech Day in November, the Pre-Competition Concert in February, the Grade 1 Parents' Orientation in April, and the Year-End Music Presentation in June.

Our school music teams also competed in the 76th Hong Kong School Music Festival and all teams secured a placing in the competitions. Additionally, the Junior Choir competed in the Hong Kong Inter-School Choral Festival and was awarded the Gold Award. The Symphonic Band took part in the Joint School Music Competition and Hong Kong Youth Music Interflows, and attained the Gold and Silver Award, respectively.

SPORTS

Sports play a vital role in the development and wellbeing of our students. We encourage physical activity amongst students, which helps them to maintain a healthy physical and emotional lifestyle.

Competitions

Athletics: Our Athletics Team achieved remarkable success in the 2023-24 Hong Kong Island East Inter-Primary Schools Athletics Competition, earning widespread admiration for their performance. All of our 38 athletes received medals in the competition. The Boys and Girls Grade B and C teams won the overall championship titles, and the Boys and Girls Grade A teams finished as runners-up. A highlight of the competition was the Boys C 4x100m relay team breaking the official record, exciting the audience and setting a new standard. 4D Chan Ming Sum Nathan was selected to participate in the All Hong Kong Inter-Area Primary Schools Athletics Competition. He secured first place in the Boys Grade C 100m in this prestigious territory-wide event.

Basketball: Our Boys Basketball Team was crowned champions of the 2023-24 Hong Kong Island East Inter-Primary Schools Basketball Competition. Notably, 6B Liu Ka Yin Ryder and 6D Yuen Ho Tim Timsley were honoured as the Most Valuable Players.

Badminton: Our Boys Badminton Team excelled in the 2023-24 Hong Kong Island East Inter-Primary Schools Badminton Competition, securing the championship title. Notably, 3B Ng Yu Him Hilton and 5A Lau Pak Yin (Andy) were recognised as the Most Valuable Players.

Swimming: The Swimming Team performed outstandingly in the 2023-24 Hong Kong Island East Inter-Primary Schools Swimming Competition. Moreover, 6D Poon Chung Cheong Brayden was selected to represent the Hong Kong Island East area in the 8th All Hong Kong Inter-Area Primary Schools Swimming Competition.

Table Tennis: The Table Tennis Team showcased commendable performance in the 2023-24 Hong Kong Island East Inter-Primary Schools Table Tennis Competition. 4A Liu Yuen Kwan Serena was awarded the Most Valuable Player title.

Football: The Boys Football Team participated in the Hong Kong East Area Inter-Primary Schools Futsal Competition and earned an overall merit. This commendable performance reflects the team's hard work, dedication, and sportsmanship throughout the competition.

Fencing: In the BOC Youth Development Programme All Primary School Fencing Competition, in the Boys C Epee category, we proudly attained first place. Our senior students continued this trend of excellence, with the Girls A Epee Team securing first place and the Boys A Foil Team achieving second place.

Rope Skipping: Our team delivered an outstanding performance at the ONE + RUN Provincial Sports Carnival. Their exceptional skills and dedication culminated in achieving the prestigious Gold Award.

AS Watsons Group Student Sports Award: To foster sports development in Hong Kong, the AS Watson Group annually offers a student's sports award for nominated outstanding students from schools all over Hong Kong. This year, 6C Hui Laam Ling (Markus), a key member of the Athletics Team was nominated because of his amazing performance in sports.

Annual Events

Sports Day: Our Sports Day in January was graced with perfect weather. Grade 1 and 2 students participated in the Mini Olympics. Their performances captivated the audience. The event was further energised by the support of 60 committed parent volunteers. 200 parents participated in the parent-child games, exemplifying the strong sense of community.

The guest of honour was Ms Wong Ka Yan, a member of the Hong Kong Sports Climbing Team whose speech and impressive demonstrations were met with great enthusiasm. Individual champions of the day were 3C Hung Dominic and 4C Birt Sophie Wei. Bull House was awarded the house champion title, while Eagle House received accolades for their spirited cheering. Additionally, Dragon House was honoured for their exemplary discipline and cleanliness.

Swimming Gala: The annual Swimming Gala was held in May. The first day of competitions was held at Victoria Park Swimming Pool. The excitement continued on the second day of the gala at the school's swimming pool, where Grade 1 and 2 students participated.

Our guest of honour, Ms Karinne Tam from the Hong Kong Speed Skating Team, provided additional inspiration to our students. Tiger House emerged as the overall champion. Notable individual achievements included 4B Xing Annie Anyi, 4D Chan Vincci Hok Sze, 5D Lau Annabelle, and 6D Tang Yuen Hei (Shannon) for the girls, and 6B Poon Chung Hang Hector and 6D Poon Chung Cheong Brayden for the boys. Hector and Brayden distinguished themselves further by breaking school records in the 50m Butterfly and 100m Freestyle events, respectively.

Activities

Spring Social 3x3 Charity Basketball Match: This match brought various members of our school community together for a day of sportsmanship and philanthropy. The event saw the participation of 50 parents and numerous alumni, all coming together to support a worthy cause.

VR Dodgeball and Esports Cycling: VR dodgeball and esports cycling were introduced to students. These activities not only promote physical activity and teamwork but also foster cognitive skills such as strategy development, quick decision-making, and hand-eye coordination. By incorporating these modern and dynamic activities, students were able to relax and have fun.

VISUAL ARTS

This year, the Visual Arts department aimed to re-engage students with their 'sensation, craftsmanship, collaboration, and connectedness'. These are the vital qualities that lost their shine during the pandemic. We are proud to highlight a few events that we organised to gain these vital qualities back.

Art on the Beach with Parent Art Buddy: Grade 1 students learnt how to sculpt large-scale sea animals with sand in this cross-curricular project with the science team that took place on St Stephen's Beach.

A Visit to the Fruit Kingdom & Art Tasting Party: A fruit party was organised for Grade 2 students on the completion of their art project, 'A Visit to the Fruit Kingdom'. During their party, their drawings were exhibited alongside the fruit buffet tables displaying fruits of different colours and textures.

Meet the Artist & Looped Play Immersive Art Experience at Hong Kong Baptist University: Grade 4 went to the Visualisation Research Centre at HKBU and visited Looped Play. The art installation was collaboratively created by a group of artists and game designers with the aim of studying the role of games in social interactions.

Visit to Kiang Malingue Gallery: Grade 5 visited Kiang Malingue Gallery and had a docent-led tour. Students also had a wonderful Meet the Gallerist session, where they asked questions and explored the relationships between the artists and the gallerists.

Visit to Rosanna Li's Exhibition at Sonata Gallery: Grade 6 visited the exhibition "The Pathway of Rosanna Li — a Journey from Comics to Clay". The exhibition was curated by Sonata Gallery at SKH St Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College.

Mural Painting Team: Our Mural Painting Team devised a captivating floor game for junior graders outside the Prayer Room. The Cosmic Capers mural, skillfully crafted by senior graders, added an element of creativity and interactive fun to the school environment.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Information technology (IT) plays a crucial role in education, enhancing teaching and learning experiences, fostering digital literacy, and preparing students for the technologically advanced world. IT also provides interactive and engaging learning experiences through educational software, multimedia resources, and online platforms.

「童擁 AI」計劃: Our school Grade 4 to 6 joined「童擁 AI」計劃 this year. 「童擁 AI」計劃 was launched by Centum Charitas Foundation. The purpose of this program is to promote the popularisation of computational thinking, digital skills and programming skills, and improve students' overall technological literacy.

AI (HuskeyLens): This year, we implemented the use of HuskyLens, an AI vision sensor, to enhance student learning and engagement. HuskyLens provided students with a practical and engaging learning experience. The implementation of HuskyLens has been a valuable addition to our educational environment. It has provided students with hands-on learning experiences, fostered creativity, and improved problem-solving skills.

RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Religious studies provide a foundation for understanding beliefs, values, and traditions, fostering respect and tolerance in our students. It encourages critical thinking about ethics, morality, and spirituality, promoting cultural awareness. Through studying about religion, students develop empathy and a broader perspective on the world.

SSCPS Mums Group and SoSo Club: As a Christian school, we are blessed to have a group of dedicated parents who conduct fellowship for our Grade 1 to 3 students and provide a weekly lunchtime programme sharing biblical stories and teachings.

Advent Wreath Making Workshop: SSCPS Mums Group held a workshop before Christmas to share the messages behind this meaningful and iconic piece. We were honoured to have Revd Lam Chun Wai (Vicar of HKSKH St Peter's Church North Point) who shared the meaning of the Advent wreath with the congregation.

Christmas Assembly and Class Party: To ensure that our students understand the real meaning of Christmas, Revd Lau Chi Leung, visiting professor of Evangel Seminary was invited to lead the Christmas sermon and festivities. Additionally, Christmas class parties were arranged.

Prayer Meetings: The Bible says: Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving (Colossians 4:2). Biweekly prayer meetings were held by the teachers to encourage students to pray to our Lord.

LIBRARY

Our library fosters a love of reading, supports the curriculum with diverse resources, nurtures information literacy skills, offers a quiet study space, and promotes community engagement. This enhances students' academic growth and holistic development.

Over the past year, our book collection grew by 5%, with the current total being approximately 22,500 books, with an equal split between Chinese and English books. Additionally, the library subscribes to 12 different magazines in both Chinese and English.

Furthermore, the library underwent a significant transformation for the Open Day, with a redesigned reading corner that now attracts more students and provides a suitable space for reading promotion activities.

Book Donations: We extend our gratitude to Mr Gordon Wong, who generously donated 227 books to the library before his retirement, and to our parents who contributed 136 books, including magazines and fiction.

Author Introduction: To encourage a love of reading, we showcase renowned authors' work in our library; J.K. Rowling's enchanting Harry Potter series, Roald Dahl's captivating Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, E.B. White's heartwarming Charlotte's Web, Zheng Yuanjie's delightful Chinese tales, Huang Yi's thrilling wuxia novels, and Liang Yusheng's epic wuxia adventures.

Reading Promotion: Various activities were held to promote a reading culture at the school, including, but not limited to the Mid-Autumn Festival Lantern Riddle Activities, daily storytelling sessions, an AI interactive book experience, and a book fair.

Book Hunt: This activity was held in the library. It helped students understand the library's collection layout, book classification, and improved their teamwork skills.

Parent Volunteers and Student Librarians: Parent volunteers play a vital role in supporting library activities. We are grateful for their help. Additionally, our dedicated team of student librarians ensures the smooth functioning of the library.

CROSS-CURRICULAR COLLABORATIONS

It is essential for students to engage in various interdisciplinary learning experiences that connect their knowledge across different subjects and foster curiosity. It also allows them to develop knowledge and generic skills.

This year, Grade 1 linked science with visual arts by crafting ocean animal sculptures. Grade 2 combined language arts, visual arts and science components to learn more about their reader. Grade 3 integrated English and mathematics through a lemonade stand project. Grade 4 combined Chinese and computer skills to create digital travelogues and conduct quantitative surveys using Excel. Grade 5 explored character strengths through tie-dye T-shirt projects. They also designed unique circular patterns with computer tools and the knowledge acquired in mathematics lessons. Grade 6 collaborated on activities merging mathematics with physical education on the topic of time, distance and speed. They also applied their knowledge of visual arts to science by using wood to construct a solar system model.

ETHICS EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Through our Ethics Education Programme (EEP), we yearn to foster an environment where love, learning, and service intertwine. To impart the message behind this year's theme "We Learn, We Love, We Serve", many activities were carried out throughout the year in addition to the weekly assemblies hosted by our teachers that focused on the main theme and its subtopics. This was not merely a motto but also a call to action, a reminder of the ethical values we strive to instil in our students.

Poor Rich Meal: In collaboration with World Vision Hong Kong, we organised the Poor Rich Meal for Grade 5. Prior to the meal, students engaged in activities that illustrated how the unequal distribution of food worldwide results from factors such as resource inequity, climate change, and human influences. The parents of Grade 5 students generously donated \$19,440 to World Vision Hong Kong.

Be a Smart Food Blogger: To raise Grade 1 to 3 students' awareness about the food wastage, students were asked to take photos of their plates for a month after each meal and upload the photos to Padlet. Photos were tagged with the hashtag "#Food Blogger" to help more people become aware of this activity.

Healthy Internet Use for Students and Parents: To enhance our students' digital security and health, The Office for Film, Newspaper and Article Administration was invited to conduct a talk on the aforementioned topic.

Cultivating Positive and Healthy Online Habits: A webinar for parents' on the use of the Internet by children was organised in collaboration with the Hong Kong Family Welfare Society. Strategies on cultivating positive healthy online habits, enhancing parent-child communication and discipline techniques for the parents were discussed and shared in the webinar.

Smoke Free Interactive Education Theatre: The Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health organised a smoke-free school interactive education theatre for Grade 2 students. Students actively participated in the activity and were able to list the negative impacts of smoking on health after the play.

Orbis Flying Eye Hospital: We were honoured to be invited by Orbis to visit their Flying Eye Hospital, a one-of-a-kind initiative that brings ophthalmic care and surgical training to the most developing regions in the world. Four exemplary prefects were chosen to take part in this exciting journey.

Inclusive Rugby Programme: Our Touch Rugby Team joined the Rugby for ALL programme organised by a Hong Kong charity, TREATS. This was a fun learning

opportunity for our team to learn about social inclusion and also to cultivate new friendships. In addition, participants had a chance to serve the community by actively taking part in the Community Carnival held in May.

Disability Awareness Day: The Hong Kong PHAB Association hosted a Disability Awareness Day for Grade 6. Through different experiential activities and sharing sessions, students learnt to be more empathetic and understanding towards the challenges faced by the people with disabilities.

Sharing by Adrian Anantawan: Adrian Anantawan, a renowned one-armed violinist, graced our students and their parents with a motivational talk. He began his talk by dispelling the fear of failure that often hinders individuals from pursuing their dreams. Adrian also treated the audience to a mesmerising performance. He emphasised the importance of resilience, urging students and parents to embrace challenges head-on.

PREFECT TRAINING

Prefects' leadership training is essential as it nurtures responsibility, teamwork, and decision-making skills amongst our student leaders. This programme cultivates confidence, integrity, and effective communication, preparing them for future leadership roles. Through this training, students learn to lead by example.

To prepare our prefects as the serving leaders, two training sessions were held this year. For the first session, Ms Christina Ma-Lau, the founder and principal of JEMS Academy shared invaluable insights on developing vital leadership skills. During the workshop, the prefects actively engaged in interactive activities and discussions that centred around teamwork, communication, problem-solving, and decision-making. In the second training session, to let our school prefects better handle daily issues, the School Mediation Development Centre organised a school mediation training session for them where our prefects learnt to handle students' conflicts.

Positive Mentors: This academic year, approximately 40 Positive Mentors (陽光學長) from Grade 3 and 4 actively mentored and supported Grade 1 and 2 students. Collaborating with teachers, they utilised recess time to offer school tours, engage in storytelling, gardening activities, and serve as playmates for board games with younger students providing positive influences within our school community.

BOARDING PROGRAMME

Our mandatory Boarding Programme offers Grade 6 students a unique and invaluable educational experience that extends beyond the traditional classroom

setting. By immersing students in a residential environment, it fosters independence, responsibility, and resilience.

Personal Management Programme: This programme offers boarders a structured framework for fostering personal growth. Led by visiting professional coaches, the training sessions encourage boarders to set goals at the start of the term and pursue them with determination. Through teamwork and group activities, boarders enhance their communication skills and learn to collaborate effectively, forming friendships that strengthen their social skills. Additionally, coaches support students in building self-esteem and cultivating positive thinking, which in turn helps them manage their emotions and navigate adversity more effectively.

Life-Skills Training: Resident tutors conducted training sessions to equip boarders with practical skills. Throughout the year, boarders participated in domestic skills workshops covering sewing, first aid, shoe polishing, cooking, and book wrapping. Additionally, they attended cultural and social skills workshops on topics such as Western dining etiquette, Chinese calligraphy, photography, and yoga. The boarders also benefited from additional workshops on eFootprint and eSafety, whole brain learning, study skills, and test-taking strategies.

Social and Cultural Activities: Various social and cultural activities were organised for the boarders to enrich their learning experiences and enhance their personal character. Notable activities included the Mid-Autumn Festival Gathering, Christmas carolling at Stanley Plaza combined with a Parent-Child Christmas Dinner at Repulse Bay Club One, watching the drama Every Brilliant Thing, and visiting the Maritime Memories exhibition hosted by our alumnus Dr Steven Chow.

English Language Programme: In addition to prep time supervised by the house wardens and resident tutors, a tailored English programme was arranged for the boarders to further enhance their English language skills and knowledge in a more relaxed and enjoyable manner.

Putonghua Language Programme: This programme aims to enhance students' proficiency in Mandarin, fostering cultural understanding and communication skills. This initiative promotes linguistic diversity and global competence among learners.

Community Service: Engaging in community service empowers boarders with empathy and social responsibility. "In Love with Grandparents" (知心甜孫) was jointly organised by our school and Aberdeen Kai-fong Welfare Association to promote cross-generational integration and appreciation. Boarders worked in groups to learn about the elderly and to experience their physical limitations. We are now recognised as the "Heart to Heart School" as the students have participated in over 500 accumulated hours of voluntary services.

INTER-HOUSE ACTIVITIES

The four houses - Tiger, Dragon, Eagle, and Bull - are a cherished tradition at SSCPS. Each student is assigned to a house on joining the school. In addition to the annual Swimming Gala and Sports Day, the school organises a variety of interhouse activities and competitions to enhance the house culture and foster a strong sense of belonging among the students. The house spirit at SSCPS is vibrant, and students actively participate in these activities with great enthusiasm.

Inter-House Friday: This new programme was met with great anticipation and enthusiasm, providing a unique opportunity for every student to showcase their talents and skills in a series of inter-house competitions. Aimed at promoting teamwork, knowledge, creativity, physical fitness, problem-solving, and life skills, six Friday afternoons throughout the academic year have been designated to host these special events. It united students and teachers in a celebration of talent, teamwork, and personal growth. Furthermore, it nurtured a strong sense of belonging, camaraderie, and healthy competition among the students.

House of the Year: We celebrated the House of the Year, with Tiger House earning the prestigious title. This recognition was accompanied by a series of exclusive activities designed for students of Tiger House. In addition to the celebratory events, Tiger House parents generously sponsored special Tiger caps for all Tiger House students, enhancing the sense of community within the house. To ensure that the celebration was inclusive, all houses participated in the festivities by enjoying ice cream during lunch.

NATIONAL SECURITY EDUCATION

National Security Education (NSE) for students plays a crucial role in fostering civic awareness, promoting patriotism, and ensuring a deeper understanding of national security issues. It aims to instil a sense of responsibility and commitment towards upholding the sovereignty, security, and stability of the nation. Various activities across subjects were organised to further enhance students' understanding and bonding with the motherland China.

Flag raising ceremonies were held every Friday morning and on important days and events. In order to carry out the ceremonies smoothly, the school formed a Flag Raising Team. Weekly training was held, and students were trained to handle the flag properly and with respect, and had to follow proper flag etiquette. Students took formal assessment before representing the school in the Flag Raising Ceremony.

Across all subjects, students engaged in diverse learning topics and activities to cultivate a strong sense of national identity, respect the rule of law, and civic

responsibilities, encouraging positive and responsible citizenship as nationals and Hong Kong residents. Additionally, teachers and the school actively organised activities to deepen students' understanding of their motherland. Through these initiatives, students had a chance to gain valuable insights into their heritage and develop a profound appreciation for their roots and national significance.

STUDENT HEALTH AND WELFARE

Vaccination

Vaccinations provide vital protection for children by safeguarding against contagious diseases, ensuring their well-being and reducing the risk of illness-related absences from school. Vaccinations shield vulnerable individuals and communities, contributing to disease control and maintaining public health standards for a safer, healthier future. This year, 586 Grade 1 to 6 students received Seasonal Influenza Vaccination provided by the Dedicare Medical Centre. 206 students from Grade 1, 5 and 6 received MMRV/MMR Vaccination while Combined DTaP-IPV vaccination was taken by 215 students of Grade 1 and G6.

Counselling Services

Over the course of the academic year, our team has been dedicated to supporting our students through a variety of challenges. We prioritised empowering our students to cultivate a deeper understanding of themselves - their strengths, weaknesses, and unique potential. This focus has been essential in helping them navigate a range of challenges, from problematic relationships and family difficulties to peer conflicts, exam stress, and lack of self-confidence. Our comprehensive counselling services conducted 270 individual sessions. These meetings allowed us to offer personalised support and we collaborated with our students to implement tailored strategies and coping mechanisms.

The Counselling Team made a concerted effort to collaborate closely with the Discipline Team in order to provide specialised support for students exhibiting behavioural issues as our shared goal is to foster an environment where each child feels heard, validated, and empowered to succeed both inside and outside the classroom.

Additionally, group counselling, workshops, and activities were facilitated. The Counselling Team worked closely with teachers and parents to ensure a holistic approach to supporting our students. Monthly meetings were held with class teachers to discuss the progress and specific needs of individual students. By

nurturing self-awareness and a positive mindset, we believe our students will be better equipped to navigate the complexities of adolescence and emerge as confident, well-rounded individuals.

OVERSEAS TOURS & CAMPS

Parent-Child Ethics Theme Tour: More than 60 parents and students from Grades 2 to 5 participated in the tour to Taipei during the Easter Holiday. Through activities such as One Day with the Blind and Dialogue in the Dark, students had the opportunity to communicate and interact with visually impaired individuals. A sharing session was also arranged with Ms Chuang Fu-Hua, known as Taiwan's Helen Keller, and her mother. Fu-Hua is visually impaired, unable to speak, and suffers from quadriplegia after surviving a horrific fire accident at the age of 10. The participants were deeply moved by her story, which fostered empathy and a sense of gratitude for all they have.

Grade 6 Education Tour: To celebrate the graduation of Grade 6 students and to broaden their horizons, an education tour to Singapore, themed Technology and Environmental Exploration was held during the Easter Holiday. The tour aimed to inspire a deeper appreciation for environmental sustainability and technological advancements and was joined by 103 graduates.

Vienna Music Concert Tour: In this tour, 64 students from the School Orchestra, led by the Principal and five teachers, went on a music tour to Aflenz and Vienna in July during the summer holiday. The students had intensive training for four days, and attended master classes hosted by Austrian professional musicians. Two concerts were held to celebrate and showcase their achievements. The orchestra was conducted by the Guest Conductors Prof. Ernst Smole and Mr Alexander Znamensky, as well as our music teachers at Pfarrkirche in Aflenz and at Haydn Hall at Esterhazy Palace in Vienna, respectively.

Taiwan Sports Tour: The School organised a Taiwan Sports Tour for the Athletics, Football, and Basketball Teams in August during the summer holiday. This provided an excellent opportunity for our students to engage in both sports training and cultural exchanges. 41 students participated in this enriching experience. In addition to the rigorous training, the tour also facilitated cultural exchanges with local students and athletes.

Grade 4 and 5 Education Camps: Education camps at the Sai Kung Outdoor Training Camp and the Silvermine Bay Outdoor Training Camp were held for Grade 4 and 5 in November, respectively. The camps encouraged students to step out of their comfort zones and work collaboratively. These camps were not merely

physical challenges, but rather transformative journeys that equipped our students with the essential skills and mindset to thrive in the future.

Grade 6 Graduation Camp: The Grade 6 Graduation Camp, held in May at the picturesque Boys' and Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong Bradbury Camp, served as a celebration of the graduates' six-year journey through primary school. The collaborative event showcased a tapestry of engaging activities, yet the true essence shone through as students reflectively revisited treasured memories, sparking an emotional evening of heartfelt moments and tears.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) plays a crucial role in fostering collaboration between parents and educators, enhancing the educational experience of students. Through open communication and engagement, the PTA bridges the gap between home and school, creating a supportive network for students' overall development.

Parent Lunch: The PTA organised a lunch gathering for parents which was attended by 302 parents. With the Principal and Deputy Principal actively interacting with parents, the lunch gathering served as an occasion for building connections among parents and provided the PTA with an opportunity to introduce upcoming activities.

Gathering with SSC Parents and SSCPS Grade 5 and 6 Parents: A dinner gathering specifically for Grade 5 and 6 parents was arranged. 68 parents attended the gathering. This gathering served as a valuable opportunity for Prep School parents to gain insights into college life, allowing them to engage with our College Principal Mrs Julie Ma and parents.

Parent Seminar: A seminar for parents, titled Cyber Security for Parents: Keeping our Children Safe Online was organised. Ms Eva Kwok, Vice President of the Hong Kong Computer Society (Vibrant Youth Cultivation) conducted the seminar. Her extensive knowledge provided valuable insights for keeping our children safe online.

Parent-Child Community Service – Gift Donation: The PTA, with the help of the school collected food items that were later given to the People's Food Bank of St James' Settlement, which in turn distributed them to families, the elderly, and children in need.

Parent-Child Community Service – Kindness Walk: Two sessions of the Kindness Walk were organised in collaboration with ImpactHK. This event created a unique opportunity to educate children about the challenges faced by individuals experiencing homelessness.

Parent-Child Community Service – Experience Day at Hong Kong Guide Dog Association: The PTA arranged four experience sessions helmed by the Hong Kong Guide Dog Association. This event was designed to raise awareness for the challenges faced by visually-impaired individuals.

Parent Volunteers Recruitment for Sports Days: The PTA helped to recruit volunteers for the Sports Day. The registration process was smooth and efficient.

Family Fun Day: With great excitement, Family Fun Day was held in December. This year's theme, "Embrace Life, Embrace Love," resonated with our previous event's focus on promoting positive thinking within the SSCPS community. A total of 2,200 tickets were sold, generating revenue of \$502,383. The PTA donated \$200,000 from the event surplus to the school.

Sale of souvenirs for fundraising: The PTA offered four fundraising products for sale this year, which included travel luggage organisers, universal travel adapters, Rubik's cubes, and beach tote bags featuring four house mascots, boosting house spirit. We are pleased to position the annual sale as an additional source of funding to support our regular events.

Souvenirs to PTA Members: As a token of gratitude for their participation in the PTA, students were given A4-sized document bags. Teachers received universal travel adapters to assist with their travel needs.

Hug Hug Teachers' Day: This annual day was held to allow students to express their appreciation for teachers' dedication and hard work. The PTA distributed blank cards prior to the event, and students brought these cards back with messages of gratitude written on them to present to their teachers on the day of the event.

Newsletters: The 50th and 51st issues were published with their content encompassing various topics and activities organised by the PTA. Furthermore, as a tribute to Mr Gordon Wong's long service, the PTA published a special print that featured an in-depth interview with him and 42 articles contributed by his long-time friends, alumni, and close parent friends.

Retirement Gift to Mr Gordon Wong: The PTA invited Dr Chui Pui Chee, a Chinese calligraphist and an SSCPS parent, to write a piece of Chinese calligraphy in XingShu as a special gift for Mr Wong.

Graduation Yearbook: The yearbooks for the Grade 6 graduates were produced with the support of the parents. These yearbooks captured and preserved many cherished moments from the students' time at SSCPS, both in school and boarding. Additionally, an e-copy option was provided in the ordering form for the first time.

e-Time Capsule: The PTA facilitated the formation of a working committee for the e-Time Capsule project amongst Grade 6 parents. On the other hand, the reunion of the third e-Time Capsule was held in August. This event was led by our 2014 graduates and supported by SSCPS teachers.

FRIENDS OF SSCPS

The Friends of SSCPS (Friends) consists of current and former parents dedicated to supporting the school community. Through their involvement, they offer valuable insights, resources, and assistance to enhance the educational experience for current students. This group fosters a sense of camaraderie, organises events, and fundraisers to contribute to the school's development, creating a network of support for generations of students to come.

Family Fun Day: Friends supported the PTA's annual Family Fun Day by participating in different activities and raised \$13,880.

Camping: An overnight camp next to the football field of SSCPS for parents and children fostering strong bonds within the school community was organised in January. Through shared experiences in nature, participants strengthened their relationships and deepened their sense of camaraderie and support within the school community. There were 110 participants at this event and 34 tents were set up.

Spring Social: Collaboratively, Friends raised over \$23,888 with St Stephen's College Alumni Association, selling cookies donated by Mr & Mrs Terence Ng, and the souvenirs from the Alumni Association. Friends remained the top fundraiser, showcasing the community's dedication to supporting the cause. The fund was transferred to the school for enhancing the Ethics Education Programme.

Parents Choir: Eighty choir members partook in the event, where our parents' choir delivered heartfelt renditions of A Clare Benediction and Roman's Medley, dedicated to Mr Gordon Wong's retirement. Friends funded the arrangement of Roman's Medley, symbolising gratitude and honouring Mr Wong's impactful legacy through music and community support.

Summer Gala Dinner: A gala dinner to honour Mr Gordon Wong's service was attended by 228 participants including students, parents, alumni, former parents, teachers and friends.
